Settled in 1850. It contains a common school and ships timber, live stock and produce. Stages twice a week to L'Amable, Herman and Boulter, fare 25c, 50c and 75c respectively. Population, 100. Mail semi-weekly. Frederick Mullett, postmaster.

Seommell Rev E (Episcopal).

BRONTE. A village on Twelve Mile creek, in Trafalgar township, Halton County, 12 miles south-east of Milton, the county seat, and 1½ from Bronte station, on the G W div G T Ry. Oakville, 4½ miles north-east, is the nearest banking point. It contains Baptist and Methodist churches and a common school, and ships produce. Stage to Palermo, 4 miles north-west, daily. Population, 250. Telegraph, GNW. Express, American. Mail daily. George K McCraney, postmaster.

BROOKFIELD STATION. A way station and post office on the Ft E br C div MCRR, in Crowland township, Welland County, 4 miles east of Welland, the county seat and nearest banking point. Telegraph, GNW. Express, American. Mail daily. F W Brookfield, postmaster.

BROOKHOLM. Also known as Brook, is a village on the Potawattemie river, in Sarawak township, Grey County, 1½ miles west of Owen Sound, the county seat, and nearest railroad and banking point. Settled in 1878. It contains a Methodist church and a public school, and ships lumber, shingles and ties. Stages to Presqu' Isle and East Linton, fare 25c, and to North Keppel, fare 50c. Population, 400. Mail daily. Geo Crane, postmaster.
