On motion of Mr. Tonge, *resolved*, That a conference be requested with his Majesty's Council, on the subject matter of the Resolution in favor of Robert King and Henry Card; and that the Clerk do request the same.

A Message from the Council by Mr. Gautier:

Mr. Speaker,

The Council have agreed to Four Resolutions of this House, for granting the following sums, Viz:

500l. for building a Light-House on Briar Island.

1822l. 11s. 4d. to discharge sundry demands against the new Government House.

228l. 11s. 6½d. to Alexander Baird.

50l. to Isaac Hildrith.

And then the Messenger withdrew.

On Motion, the House resolved itself into a Committee of the whole House, to consider further of a Supply to be granted for the support of His Majesty's Government.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair,

Mr. Pyke took the Chair,

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair.

The Chairman reported from the Committee, that they had gone through the business to them referred, and that the Committee had come to several Resolutions thereupon, on which they had framed a Bill for applying certain monies for the service of the year 1806; and he read the Report in his place, and afterwards delivered the Bill in at the Clerk's Table, where the Resolutions and Clauses therein contained, were severally read, throughout, a first and second time, and, upon the Question put thereupon, agreed to by the House.

On motion, the said Bill was read a first time.

*Resolved*, That the Bill be now read a second time; and the same was read accordingly.

*Ordered*, That the Bill be engrossed.

On Motion, the House came to two Resolutions, as follows, viz.

Whereas the present Session of General Assembly, has been protracted to an unusual length, owing to the Public Accounts not being delivered in to this House in due time:

*Resolved*, therefore, that all Public Accounts ought to be laid before this House on the First day of the Sessions of General Assembly; and that unless those Accounts are delivered in within the First Week of any future Sessions, this House will not hold itself obliged to investigate the Accounts at such Sessions.

*Resolved*, That the foregoing Resolution, and the Act of the General Assembly "for taking, examining, and stating, the Public Accounts of this Province," be published in the Royal Gazette.

An engrossed Bill, for applying certain Monies therein mentioned, for the service of the year 1806, was read a third time.

*Resolved*, That the Bill do pass, and that the Title be, An Act for applying certain Monies therein mentioned, for the service of the year 1806, and for appropriating such part of the Supplies granted in the present Session of General Assembly, as are not already appropriated by the Laws or Acts of the Province.

*Ordered*, That the Clerk do carry the Bill to the Council, and desire their concurrence to the same.
