The following act has just been promulgated by Sir Henri Joly de Lotbiniere: "LABOUR REGULATION ACT, 1900."

Under the provisions of section 3 of the aforesaid Act, His Honor toe Lieutenant-Governor, in Council, has been pleased to appoint all Provincial Constables officers for the purpose of the "Labour Regulation Act," with power to issue certificates as set forth in Schedule A thereto, and to perform all other duties and function

Prescribed by the Act.

1. Particular attention is called to sections 2 to 6, inclusive, of the said Act, which are as follows:—

"2. 'Employer' includes any body of persons, corporate or unincorporate. 'Workman' includes any person who is engaged in any employment to which this act applies, whether by way of manual labour or otherwise, and whether his argreement is oral or in writing.

"3. This Act shall not apply to any person possessed of a certificate in the form set out in the Schedule A to this Act annexed, and signed by the Provincial Secretary or any officer appointed by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council for (a.)
