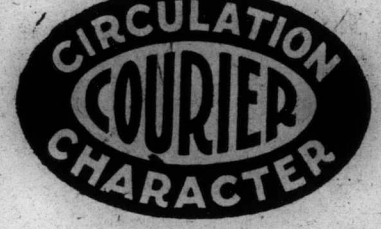

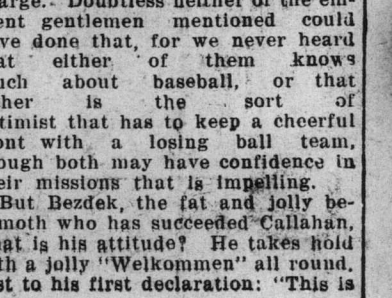
CREW SAFE

San Francisco, July 25.—One half the lumber mills in Oregon and Washington have been forced to close, due to strikes called by the Industrial Workers of the World, according to a statement to-day by A. A. Baxter, general manager of the Douglas Fir and Exportation Company. The mills are closing down rapidly, said Baxter. "It will not be long before all of them are closed if the I.W.W. agitation lasts. Lumber for airplane construction will be cut off entirely unless some definite action is taken by the government."
