The Crown Prince Continues Prodigious Effort To Oust French Forces from Chemins-des-Dames

Grand Headquarters of the French Army in France, July 27 .-(by the Associated Press)—The Germans in a persistent effort to recapture at least some part of the Chemin-des-Dames, transferred their attention today to the region of Hurtebise, on which they launched a strong attack, supported by heavy artillery concentrations. The infantry assaulted again and again, but despite the heavy masses thrown into the action they were unable to secure any ad-vantage other than an entrance into a small section of advanced posts on French trenches to the south of Ailles

Some of the Prussian Regiments Lost Half of Their Effectives in Recent Fighting With French
