

Prizes Presented at Poultry Show.

The Poultry Exhibition in the C.L.B. Armory was again visited by large numbers yesterday, who were very pleased with the splendid display that the Association has given. At 9 o'clock last night the exhibition was officially closed and the prizes distributed. His Excellency the Governor and Lady Harris with Capt. Saltmarsh as A.D.C., were present and with President and Mrs. LeMessurier and Doctor Campbell and the members of the Committee occupied the platform. The various prizes were presented by Lady Harris to the lucky winners who were heartily applauded. After the presentation a vote of thanks to His Excellency the Governor and Lady Harris for the great interest they had shown in the Exhibition and for the kindness of Lady Harris in presenting the prizes, was proposed by Hon. Dr. Campbell and seconded by Mr. G. R. Williams, was heartily accorded. His Excellency replied on behalf of himself and Lady Harris thanking the Association and those present for their vote of thanks, and congratulated the Poultry Association on both the improved quality of the birds and on the great success of the 1920 Exhibition. At the close of the Governor's speech the singing of the National Anthem brought the show to a close. This has been the most successful exhibition that the Poultry Association has held, and during the three days that the show was open 3,000 people visited the C.L.B. Armory. The energetic committee in charge of the affair worked hard in arranging the exhibition and they should feel justly proud of the success of their efforts.
