

NEWSFAPTHES FROM THE UNITED STATES.-We learn that an amendment has been authorized by the Postmaster-deneral in respect to the rate of postage to be charged on newspapers coming in from the United States addressed to reg-ular subscribers in Canada. The instruc-tions issued on the 1st of April, constitu-ted this rate at two cents each paper-the amendment reduces the rate to one cent. This reduction will also apply to Ameri-can papers sent to regular subscribers by newsdealers in the Dominion. In fact the position of this class of paper reverte what it was before the 1st of April. Transient American newspapers coming in from the States will continue to be ita-ble on de very to a charge of two cents.
