

Those who have anticipated a great influx of Chinese labor will be interested in learning of the failure of the famous Koo-man-schap, who has been largely engaged in the introduction of Chinese laborers into the United States. Mr. Koo-man-schap, it appears, has been overthrown financially by his contracts in the South. The Chinese have failed to repay him the advances made to them for passage money and other allowances, and he is unable to find any means of compelling them to fulfill their contracts. Mr. Koo-man-schap was engaged in business in San Francisco as a commission agent. His liabilities amount to about \$200,000, while his assets are comparatively worthless. His bankruptcy will be likely to discourage those who have entertained projects for importing labor from China.
