Riverside and Victoria Schools Will Have Instructors To Superintend the Children There During July and August

The school board will undertake an experimental program of playground work during the summer vacation in all of the schools playgrounds in the city and all of the playgrounds will be kept going. In two of the playgrounds there will be regular appointed supervisors of play—Mr. Morgan and Mrs. Morgan.

Sonnier Suppy Case Will Be Heard Again Before a Jury

A new trial was ordered by the supreme court en banc in the Sonnier Suppy case yesterday an appeal for that being made by A. McCallum.

According to the plaintiff she met the defendant in October, 1911, and started giving him lessons in French which she was then teaching in St. Hilma's college. The defendant then said he wished to improve the financial status of the plaintiff and she then made an agreement with him to sell her house and lots and purchase 15 acres in East Calgary near the C.P.R. shops.

FIRE LOSS IN STATES INCREASES AT MOST ALARMING RATE

Most of Damage Is Done of Deliberate Purpose; Ravage of Arson Yearly in the States Is Declared To Be Over One Thousand Million Dollars

INSURANCE COMPANIES ARE MAKING PROFITS

Immunity of Fire Raisers Is the Great Problem, for the States Have the Finest and Most Elaborately Equipped Brigades in the Whole World

About \$50,000,000 of property is annually burnt up in the United States. That is, there is a loss of \$100,000,000 per capita loss sustained through fire by the population of America.

STEEL AND IRON RAW MATERIALS TO GO ON FREE LIST

Pig Iron, Ferro Manganese, Steel Blooms, Slabs and Billets Transferred by Committee in Congress Dealing With Tariff Bill

Washington, June 16.—The transfer to the free list of the tariff bill of iron and steel raw materials, with an estimated dutiable value of more than \$50,000,000 a year, was approved today by the majority members of the senate finance committee.

To the free list were added pig iron, ferro manganese, steel blooms, slabs and billets. On all finished steel products an average reduction of 10 per cent was made from the Underwood rates.

Lead zinc and aluminum were left to be determined upon later. Aluminum will be changed from an ad valorem to a specific tariff basis and the duty will be reduced, but it will not be transferred to the free list, as many had advocated.
