Malahide Township Council.

The above council held their regular
meeting in the council chamber on Mon-
day. The following accounts were pre-
sented and ordered paid: Thomas Riddle,
repairing road, \$1 40; A. A. Leslie, supplies,
etc., \$20; W. Beckett, gravel, \$2 40; W. E.
Smith, election services, \$9 50; E. C. Mon-
teith, printing, \$19; E. O. Fairbrother,
preparing statement, \$4; John Liddle, re-
funded dog tax, \$1; E. B. Hill, election
services, \$11; John McLennan, rent of hall,
\$4; Allen Moore, sheep killed, \$5; Mrs. In-
gram, sheep killed, \$11.

Cohoon—Lindsay—That by-law No. 705,
to impose a special drainage rate upon the
south part of lot No. 8 in the 6th concession,
be read and finally passed.

Westover—Mathews—That by-law No.
704, being a by-law to impose a special
drainage rate upon the south part of lot
No. 7, in the 6th concession, be read and
finally passed.

Lindsay—Mathews—That the reeve, Co-
hoon and Westover be a committee to re-
pair bridge at Chute gully.

Cohoon—Westover—That Lindsay and
Mathews be a committee to make examina-
tion of outlet on 9th concession, opposite
lot 7, with power to act.

Westover—Mathews—That the auditors'
report be accepted and that the reeve be
authorized to sign a check for their services
and charge the same to account of township
officers.

Lindsay—Mathews—That Westover and
Cohoon be a committee to examine side
road between lots 5 and 6, 4th con., and
make such repairs as are necessary.

Mathews—Lindsay—That J. Nelson be
assessor for 1901 at a salary of \$95.

Westover—Cohoon—That in the opinion
of this council the sugar beet industry
would be a great boon to the farmers of this
province, and that we would respectfully
memorialize the Provincial Government to
grant such aid to the industry as they may
deem advisable.

Lindsay—Westover—That council do
now adjourn to meet the first Monday in
March at 10 o'clock a.m.
