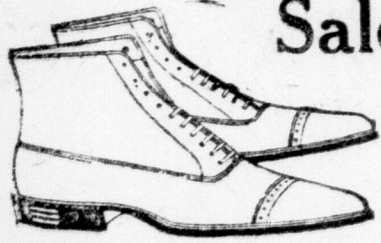

Many Extra Attractions Help
To Make a Well-Balanced
Bill.

"Marie, Ltd.," Allen Brady's latest Select picture, which was seen at the Majestic Theatre last night, is assuredly one of the best pictures she has ever made. Miss Brady is cast in a role for which she is well fitted and gives an admirable characterization of the girl who gave up a promising career to take a position in her mother's fashionable millinery establishment on Fifth Avenue.
