

THE SPORTING WORLD

The Comyns and his fighters have been remanded for two weeks. Pedestrians are puzzled over Hazell's sudden departure for England. The Cincinnati club have twenty-five men under contract for next season.

The Bostonians have won 33 out of the 49 games on their own grounds this season. Helen Blinn, the 2 year old racing filly, dropped dead on the course at Lexington, while exercising.

The Metropolitan club will have a new ball field next season, separate from the New York's grounds. At Trenton, Tenn., Saturday, Tim Haggerty defeated Alf Love in a race of 150 yds. in 1:07 sec.

With but one or two exceptions the Boston nine of 1884 will be the same as the present organization. The international regatta, which was fixed to take place on Thursday, at St. Clair, Mich., has been postponed until next year.

Daniel O'Leary writes to the Turf, Field and Farm that he lost his races in Australia with Edwards through treachery of his attendants. Queen Han, the \$15,000 filly, who, during the spring, was so strongly fancied for the Kentucky Derby, is said to have gone completely amiss.

It looks as though four mule races will soon come to a close. The last one at Sheepshead was a virtual walk over, and now the Bowie stakes at Baltimore has failed. Deagle of the Cincinnati team wants \$1300 for 1884. The directors offer him \$1000. Deagle says that unless his terms are complied with he will go back to his trade.

James McKee, late manager of the Chicago Union club, is trying to organize a stock company in Minneapolis with a view to obtaining a strong nine in the field next season. Since the organization of professional nines in Boston and Chicago the representative clubs of these cities have played 120 games, of which the Chicagoans have won 53 to the Bostonians 67.

Fowler of the Cincinnati club has not dropped a fly ball this season. His record was very clean in this respect last season, as he only had one muff in his error column for the whole year. The Dwyers say they bought Hartford for the purpose of working him with George Kinney, who is developing the same trait as Morschist, who would not run unless his rider had the colors on.

The directors of the Providence baseball club, Tuesday night tried to declare a dividend of 100 per cent on the capital stock. The stockholders refused to accept it, and the directors were forced to resign. Princes George and a party of friends have gone to the celebrated racing grounds at Longford, where they will be met by a good many American and Canadian gentlemen, generally being entirely at a discount.
