ations made by commercial organizations. Efforts have been put forth from time to time to add to its completeness, and consequently increase its value, and until a very recent period it served its purpose very acceptably.

But late changes in the manner of storage have changed conditions some, and the methods of compling the figures need to be revised and adapted to the existing circumstances if the compliation is to retain its hitherto valuable features. We refer to the unusually large accumulations of grain in private warehouses, especially in Chicago and at Minneapolis. Practically these accumulations add just so much to the actual "stocks," but by a "figment of the imagination" are not "visible" to the complier of the weekly statement, though it is necessary for him to shut his eyes in order that he shall not see them.

The absurdity of such a proceeding was strikingly illustrated last week, when one of the elevators at Minneapolis containing 901,000 bushels of wheat changed from a "regular" to a "private" warehouse, and its contents, without a kernel being distributed in the bins, disappeared from view—theoretically—as completely as if swallowed up in the ocean or destroyed by fire. The result was a theoretical decrease of 749,000 bushels in the supply that was "visible," though the actual fact was that there had been an actual increase of 152,000 bushels.

It has been claimed that "figures cannot lie," but this incident illustrates that they may be made to deceive or mislead.
