These are the clauses in the bylaw: All bridges now existing upon any of the roads hereinbefore mentioned, except the bridge over the Rouge River, shall remain the property of and be maintained by the municipal corporation of the County of York, in the same manner and to the same extent as the county bridges, within the said county.

The municipal corporation of the County of York shall remain liable for and shall pay the existing debt or overdraft due in respect of the York roads' account of the said corporation, and the minor municipalities aforesaid shall not be called upon to pay any portion of the said existing debt or overdraft, save and except to the extent of their respective proportions of the county rate necessary to pay such indebtedness or overdraft based upon the equalized assessment of such minor municipalities.

This bylaw will not take effect or be in force until the local municipal corporation of the County of York shall have agreed with this corporation for the abolition of all market fees in the said city of Toronto, and the fees collected at the cattle market.
