SEALED TENDERS addressed to the undersigned, and enclosed "Tender for the Welland Canal" will be received at this office, from mechanical, skilled practical contractors, until the arrival of the Eastern and Western trains on Wednesday, the NINTH day of MARCH next, for raising the walls of the locks, width, length, increasing the height of the banks on that part of the Welland Canal between Port Dalhousie and Thorold.

The works throughout will be given in sections.

A map showing the different places together with plans and descriptive statements can be seen at this office on and after Tuesday, the 22d February instant, where printed forms of tender can be obtained. A like class of information relative to the work will be supplied at the Resident Engineer's Office, Thorold.

The amount required in each case will be stated on the form of tender.
