

INSTRUMENT FOR THE AMENDMENT OF THE CONSTITUTION
OF THE INTERNATIONAL LABOUR ORGANIZATION

Adopted at Montreal, October 9, 1946

The General Conference of the International Labour Organization
Having been convened at Montreal by the Governing Body of the Inter-
national Labour Office, and having met in its Twenty-ninth Session on 13 September 1946; and

Having decided upon the adoption of amendments to the Constitution of the International Labour Organization a question which is included in the second item on the agenda of the Session, to the following instrument:

Article 2

Two copies of this Instrument of Amendment shall be authenticated by the signatures of the President of the Conference and of the Director-General of the International Labour Office. One of these copies shall be deposited in the archives of the International Labour Office and the other shall be communicated to the Secretary-General of the United Nations for registration in accordance with Article 102 of the Charter of the United Nations and the Director-General will communicate a certified copy of the Instrument to all the Members of the International Labour Organization.

Article 3

1. The formal ratifications or accretions of the Instrument of Amendment shall be communicated to the Director-General of the International Labour Office, who shall notify the Members of the Organization of the receipt thereof.

2. This Instrument of Amendment will come into force in accordance with the provisions of Article 36 of the Constitution of the Organization.

3. On the coming into force of this Instrument, the Director-General of the International Labour Office shall so notify all the Members of the International Labour Organization, the Secretary-General of the United Nations, and all States having signed the Charter of the United Nations.
