

Article XV (Deceased Members and their Estates)

47. The military authorities of Canada shall have the right to take charge of and deal with the body of a member who dies in Ghana and may dispose of his personal property after the debts of the deceased member incurred in Ghana and owing to persons ordinarily resident therein are paid.

PART III—TERMS OF SERVICE

Article XVI (Length of Tour)

48. Members normally will serve in Ghana for a tour of two years' duration including sixty days' home leave at mid-tour.

49. The Canadian Armed Forces Liaison Officer may at his discretion direct any member to serve a shorter tour in the interests of the Armed Forces of Ghana or the Canadian Forces.

Article XVII (Leave)

50. Members will be granted sixty days' mid-tour leave. All mid-tour leave will include travelling time outside Ghana for which no extra time will be allowed. Mid-tour leave will be taken in a temperate climate.

51. Seven days' local leave will be granted in each year of the tour.

52. Sick leave will be granted to members at the discretion of the Director of Medical Services of the Armed Forces of Ghana. Sick leave will not count against other leave entitlements.

53. Compassionate leave to Canada will be granted to members under the Canadian military regulations in effect at the time, and such leave will count against other leave entitlements. When a member is granted compassionate leave within three months of completing his normal residential service in Ghana, his residential service will be considered to have been terminated.

Article XVIII (Rank and Promotion)

54. Members will remain eligible for promotion under Canadian military regulations.

Article XIX (Canadian Pay and Allowances)

55. The Government of Canada will be responsible for providing all the normal Canadian pay and allowances to members.

Article XX (Ghana Allowances)

56. The Government of Ghana agrees to pay a daily allowance which is to be related to a cost of living index for Ghana as established by an agreement between the Government of Ghana and the Government of Canada. The table in Schedule A to this Agreement indicates the rates of allowance which would have been payable relative to the cost of living on June 30, 1961.

57. The allowance provided by the Government of Ghana under this Article will be paid from the date of arrival in Ghana of a member until the date of his final departure inclusive.

58. The Government of Ghana agrees to issue at its expense, rations to all members who are in hospital or on field training exercises in Ghana and to their dependents who are in hospital.
