The Trade Post Readership Survey

Many thanks to everyone who completed our readership survey. The compliments are encouraging, and the criticism constructive. Here's what we discovered from your responses:

"Readership doubled from the first issue in January 1994 to the April 1995 issue".

Almost all of you (85%) find the Trade Post (TP) either useful or very useful.

THERE IS LARGE CONSENSUS (87%) THAT AN INFORMATIVE TP IS MOST IMPORTANT. A LIGHT, INFORMAL, FRIENDLY AND PERSONAL NEWSLETTER RANKS SECOND IN PRIORITY.

YOU INDICATE SATISFACTION WITH TP'S CONTENT RELEVANCY AND VARIETY, WRITING STYLE, ARTICLE LENGTH, LEGIBILITY, AND OVERALL APPEAL. WE GOT THE MESSAGE THAT OUR GRAPHICS AND VISUALS NEED SOME IMPROVEMENT.

YOUR FIRST CHOICE IN TOPICS IS BEST PRACTICES; FOLLOWING IN SEQUENCE ARE INNOVATIVE DEVELOPMENTS, CURRENT EVENTS, THE IMPACT OF TECHNOLOGY, AND LASTLY, TRADE POLICY CHANGES.

We had an overwhelming response (87%) in favour of an "issues update" column.

OPEN-ENDED COMMENTS ALLOW US TO HEAR YOUR INPUT

AND SUGGESTIONS ON TOPICS WE DIDN'T SPECIFICALLY ASK ABOUT:

"How about a corner featuring ideas (from posts) which have worked like the TEST article and Recognizing Importers?"

"GET RETIRED TRADE COMMISSIONERS WHO ARE ACTIVE IN BUSINESS TO CONTRIBUTE."

"Too T-Branch focussed — Needs more post perspectives. More of Ezio's stories should be encouraged."

"IT COULD INCLUDE SELECTED ARTICLES ON INDUSTRY AND TECHNOLOGICAL BREAKTHROUGHS AND SERVICES THAT REPRESENT CANADIAN COMPETITIVE ADVANTAGE."

"DON'T SEND IT BY E-MAIL. IT WILL NOT GET READ AMONG THE PILE OF STUFF WE GET."
