2. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Twenty-six million six hundred and twenty thousand dollars be granted to His Majesty, for Railways and Canals—Capital—Canadian Government Railways—Rolling stock ,\$25,000,000; Purchase of steamers McKee and Drummond, \$1,020,000; To provide for building of two wooden ships

\$600,000, for the year ending 31st March, 1918.

Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Three million six hundred and sixty-seven thousand seven hundred and forty-five dollars and seven cents be granted to His Majesty, for Railways and Canals—Capital—Railway Subsidy—To provide amount required to be paid for the Quebec, Montmorency and Charlevoix Railway, the Quebec and Saguenay Railway, and the Lotbinière and Mégantic Railway, and for the equipment, appurtenances and properties used in connection with such Railways, to be acquired under the authority of a Statute passed at the last Session; and to provide for the cost of completing, equipping and operating the said railways—the operating expenses to be chargeable to Revenue—Revote, for the year ending 31st March, 1918.
