

## THE SENATE OF CANADA

### RESOLUTION 44.

A Resolution for the relief of Dawn Amelia  
McCracken Rattray.

*[Adopted 23rd February, 1966.]*

**W**HEREAS Dawn Amelia McCracken Rattray, residing at the city of New York, in the state of New York, one of the United States of America, wife of Basil Andrew Rattray, who is domiciled in Canada and residing at the city of Montreal, in the province of Quebec, has by her petition alleged that they were married on the sixth day of March, A.D. 1955, at the city of Fredericton, in the province of New Brunswick, she then being Dawn Amelia McCracken; and whereas by her petition she has prayed that, on the ground of his adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of her petition be granted: Therefore the Senate of Canada, pursuant to the provisions of the DISSOLUTION AND ANNULMENT OF MARRIAGES ACT and subject to section 2 thereof, resolves as follows:—

**1.** On the expiration of thirty days from the date of the adoption by the Senate of this resolution, the said marriage shall be dissolved and thenceforth shall be null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.
