#### DISAPPEARANCE OF CANADIAN NAVAL OFFICER

### Question No. 1.250-Mr. Fisher:

1. Did a Royal Canadian Navy officer disappear last summer into the Mediterranean sea area?

2. Was he found and, if so, where?

3. What were the actions taken to recover such a lost officer, and what disciplinary action was taken?

4. Has the navy an explanation for the reasons that may have led to the disappearance?

Mr. Harkness: 1. In April, 1962, an officer of the Royal Canadian Navy was absent without authority from his ship when the latter sailed from Portsmouth, England, to Canada. His whereabouts were at the time unknown.

- 2. Yes, he appeared at the Canadian consulate in Hamburg, Germany, on 28 November, 1962, requesting papers for a visit to South Africa, and was then identified as the missing officer.
- 3. A warrant was issued for his arrest as a suspected deserter and suitable steps were taken to trace and apprehend him. He was

CANADIANS LEAVING TO TAKE UP U.S. RESIDENCE arrested at Hamburg by the Canadian Army provost corps. He was tried at Halifax, Nova Scotia, by general court martial on 12 December, 1962, on a charge of desertion under section 79 of the National Defence Act. He was found guilty and sentenced to imprisonment for one year and is now undergoing this sentence in a civil prison in Nova Scotia.

4. It is understood that the reasons were personal and not connected with his service in the Royal Canadian Navy.
