CANADA-U.S. FOREST PRODUCTS PACT

Question No. 268—Mr. Douglas:

1. Has the government initiated or participated in any discussions that could lead to a Canadian-United States forest products pact similar to the present Canada-United States automotive agreement?

2. If so, where, when and with whom were such discussions held?

Mr. C. M. Drury (Minister of Industry): The Department of Industry is actively looking into all possible means of expanding production and trade in Canadian secondary products, including forest products. The question of reducing barriers to trade on these and other products is also being discussed at Geneva by the respective GATT delegations.

CONFERENCE ON SECOND TRANS-CANADA HIGHWAY

Question No. 271—Mr. Lambert:

1. Has the Government of Canada during the calendar year 1965 been in touch with any of the Governments of the Provinces of Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia with regard to the construction of a second highway of Trans-Canada standard from Winnipeg to the Pacific coast via Saskatoon, Edmonton and the Yellowhead Pass?

2. If so, what has been the nature of the correspondence or conversations, and with whom?

3. Has any further consideration been given to the calling of a joint conference between the Government of Canada and the four provincial governments in question with respect to the construction of such a highway and what are the views of the Government of Canada as to the advisability of such a conference at an early date?
