A Message was received from the Senate, as follows:—
Resolved,—That the Senate doth unite and approve of the Resolution as passed by the House of Commons on Monday, June 30th, 1924,

That it is expedient that section ninety-one of the British North America Act, 1867, be amended by adding thereto the following subsection in lieu of that set forth in the Address of the Senate and House of Commons to His Majesty the King, adopted by the House and Senate respectively, on the 24th and the 26th June, 1920:—

"2. An enactment intra vires of the Parliament of Canada, if expressed to operate extra-territorially, shall have and be deemed to have had, that operation, if and in so far as it is a law for or ancillary to

the peace, order and good government of Canada."
