On motion of the Honorable Mr. Letellier de St. Just, seconded by the Honorable Mr. McClelan, it was

Ordered, That the Forty-second Rule of this House be dispensed with, in so far as it relates to this Bill, and that the same be read a third time presently.

The said Bill was then read a third time accordingly.

The question was put whether this Bill shall pass?

- It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons, and acquaint that House that that the Senate have passed this Bill, without any amendment.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill intituled, "An Act to incorporate The Standard Marine Insurance Company of Canada," was read a second time.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Ferrier, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Kaulbach,

it was

Ordered, That the said Bill be referred to the Committee on Banking, Commerce and Railways.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill intituled "An Act to amend an Act "respecting the Administration of Justice and for the establishment of a Police Force in "the North-West Territories," was read a second time.
