Dear Mr. Peddie:-

I thank you for your letter of January 20th. I am glad to know that you have the same interest in the student teachership scheme as had your predecessor. I am enclosing you herewith a formal report on Mr. Gower by Professor Taugh, who is in immediate charge of his work in the Graduate School and whom you will note is very satisfied.

Might I ask that at the same time you will send us a report on Mr. McOdum, in order that the continuation of his scholarship for another year may be decided.

It seems appropriate at this time to make a remark concerning the print sent out in January this year regarding the conditions. There was some difficulty about Mr. Gower's appointment, owing to the fact that the print and the correspondence did not agree. The print calls for students coming here both to follow the post graduate course and to teach. This is not in accordance with paragraph 2 of your official letter of April 3rd or with our own sent under cover of letter of May 4th. Might I suggest that as the print emanates from your office a revised edition should be prepared in accordance with our memorandum, so far as we are concerned.

There is one other change to be made in our memorandum which is that we are allowing, instead of \$1,200., £250 (plus £50 for travelling ~~expenses~~ allowance for the first year).
