Advance in Corn Was Spectacular

Heavy Buying Ended in Run-Down Market—All Grains Strong.

Chicago, March 19.—Bulging prices for corn today led to an exciting flurry in the market.

CATTLE PRICES WERE UNCHANGED

Sheep, Lambs, Calves and Hogs Were Firm on Thursday.

Receipts of live stock at the Union yards were 50 carloads, comprising 660 calves, 1335 hogs, 70 sheep and lambs, and 132 calves.

Prices for all classes of fat cattle were unchanged, unless it was that they were easier on Monday last.

Stocks and feeders were reported as being slow sale.

Milkers and springers of extra choice quality still bring good prices.

Sheep, lambs and calves are very firm, while hogs remain steady.

Butchers—Choice butchers sold at \$7.75 to \$8; good, \$7.00 to \$7.50; choice cows, \$6.75 to \$7.00.

Stocks and feeders—Prices of steers, \$6.00 to \$6.50; hogs, \$6.00 to \$6.50.

Milkers and springers—Receipts of milkers and springers were 1000 head.
