

invention is, to enable the driver more readily to raise the cariole over such obstructions. This form adapts it for making new roads in snow over which it slides, leaving a smooth track, while the snow is made more compact. An inconvenience soon takes place in roads, which are constantly used. The snow collecting in front, and the machine being lifted over it, by the driver or the strength of the horse, it soon intimates waves; and the motion becomes very uneasy.

Attempts have been made to lead the peasantry, to adopt some improvement in their carioles, in order to remedy this, but without success.

Carioles used by gentlemen of fortune, are constructed and decorated at considerable expence. They are light, airy, and elegant. The fur blankets used in them, and the fur which is worn by the proprietors, exhibit great taste and wealth.

The horses are not harnessed by the side of each other, but draw in a line. This creates an impediment to those, who pass to and from the States, and Canada in winter. The roads of neither are adapted to the vehicles
