EUGENE V. DEBS WILL SPEAK

Say Aid. Hanlan and Bowman After an Investigation.

A Trip to the Crematorium-What The World Saw-The Remarks of the Two Councilors Made-Their Intention to Do Something-Other Items.

Aid. Hanlan and Bowman were discussing the case and crematory question in the street Commissioner's office yesterday afternoon when Aid. Hanlan jumped up and said:

"I see this whole shooting match, for myself. I don't believe it costs any such money to run these crematories. We will get back, Bowman, and we will see this dead dog dump."

That is how Aid. Hanlan and Bowman started on their tour of investigation.

The crematory was invited to join them. The much-talked-of "dead dog dump" was first visited.

After a thorough examination of the place and the roadway now being built from the Cherry-street bridge through the marsh along the Government breaker, no fault could be found.

With this in mind, the two councilors returned to the office of the aldermen.

"This seems to be all right," said Aid. Bowman. "It will make a splendid roadway in time."

"What's the use of all this stone in this breaker? It has answered its purpose, and has been used for nothing else."

"Thousands of dollars could be saved if this stone was used for the macadam roads. I will make a note of this," said Aid. Hanlan.

The foreman informed them that an average of 60 loads of good solid garbage was dumped there every day, but, as the crematory was not to be used, the loads of rot they are seeing to dump on me tomorrow.

The crematory was visited and the aldermen held their noses while the foreman was describing the assortment of rotteness that is daily destroyed.

"We had one load of rotten eggs just a few minutes ago. That's them that smell so bad. We get about 50 loads a day and there is always two or three dogs."

"And this is the stuff that they want to do that roadway?" said Aid. Hanlan.
