don Before Christmas. London, Nov. 27.—The Right Hon. C. J. Rhodes is coming home shortly, and may be expected in England before Ohristmas. His visit will be principally in connection with the extension of the railway beyond Bulu-wayo to the shores of Luke Tanganylka-another link in the Cape-to-Cairo line. Mr. Rhodes upon the occasion of his last visit asked the British Government to give him the benefit of their good name to en-noble him to raise the capital required at 3 per cent. Now that the Khalifa is disposed of they may be more disposed to second his efforts.

Mr. Rhodes will be able to assure Mr. Chamberlain that the recently-opened line to Buluwayo is already more than paying its way.


