St. Petersburg, July 5.—The situation regarding the armistice is as follows: Russia has formally signified to Presi-dent Roosevelt her desire for a lasting peace not only by the appointment of plenipotentiaries, who will be accom-panied by experts, fully empowered to conclude a treaty subject only to the ratification of the respective govern-ments, but as a final step has indicated her readiness to suspend hostilities. Chief Tun-Kan Seykia heard a rumor a few days ago to the effect that the Dom-inion government was going to buy land, comprising the Pipestone reserve and that the Irdians on the reserve would be forced to take up land at the Oak River reserve. He decided to enter a profest, claiming that there was none too much land at the Oak River reserve for the Indians already there. The chief was informed that the govern-ment would do rothing in the matter of purchasing Pipestone reserve land without at Caledonia Springs, with 560 acres of land and the springs, to the Cana-dian Pacific Railway Company, for \$200,000 cash.
