Chairman of Publicity Committee Will Welcome Help.

PLANS NOW MATURING

Headquarters Busy Preparing for Big Drive to Start November 12.

Bustle and preparation marked the Victory Loan headquarters today. The various committees are rapidly rounding into shape, and the big drive is due for the beginning of the week of November 12, in which it is hoped to raise \$50,000 in London and the county of Middlesex.

Major Gordon Ingram, chairman of the publicity committee, and J. J. Foote, chairman of the teams committee, were in Toronto on Friday in conference with Victory Loan headquarters, and received much information to be of value and assistance in conducting the local campaign.

Fellow Toronto Plan. Major Ingram stated today that he would follow up the Toronto idea of appointing various sub-committees, which, in turn, will appoint their own assistants.

The publicity committee will be divided into six parts. Chairman will be appointed at the beginning of the week. There will be a committee appointed to issue statements to the press. Another group will be in charge of posters, street car advertising, etc. There will also be a committee to arrange for speakers and meetings in the churches, theatres, or halls.

A "local stunt" committee will also be formed. It will look after any publicity not under Government supervision. Major Ingram asks for suggestions along this line. Hints for slogans, noise producers, lights, or anything that will help to bring the Victory Loan before the people, will be readily received by Major Ingram. Ask Merchants' Help. The fifth sub-committee will interview merchants to see if they can give space in their advertisements for Victory Loan matter.

The last committee, to look after the schools, is considered a most important one by Major Ingram, as it is the children who will take an important part in helping to raise London's share of the loan.
