HYDRO GETS POWER. Canadian Niagara Gives it Eleven Thousand Horse Power.

Hon. Wallace Nesbitt, K.C., president of the Canadian Niagara Power Company, stated yesterday that he had placed at the disposal of the Tydro 11,000 horse power, of the 15,006 horse power, which the commission claims he had promised to supply them this year. This is in addition to the 10,000 horse power recently cut off by the breakdown of a generator.

The hydro could have it as soon as they could link up.

Officials of the hydro stated last night that they had received no official confirmation of this.

COMMISSION RULE IN MONTREAL IN PROSPECT

Lord Shaughnessy Among Those Who Will Govern Affairs.

Montreal. Dec. 15.-The ration of the affairs of the City of Montreal will pass from the hands of the mayor, controllers and aldermen and be handled by a commission of which Lord Shaughnessy, Sir Alexander Lacote and Senator Beaubien are the more important members, it was announced by a prominent member of the reform element this morning.

The aldermen and controllers will be paid the balance of their salaries for their terms and be released.

Mayor Martin is to be retained as ex-officio chairman of the commission as he cannot be deposed. appropriations will be made for five years in an attempt to straighten out the city's financial tangle.

PROHIBITION IN MASSACHUSETTS


