N. B. CHECK FOR \$50,000 SENT TO SCHOOL BOARD

First Payment Received On Vocational School Building Account

DAYLIGHT TIME PLAN ADOPTED

Reports Submitted At Meeting of Saint John Trustees

A check for \$50,000 from the Province of New Brunswick has been received by the Saint John School Board as the first payment on account of the Vocational School Building, for which the Federal and Provincial grants, in equal amounts, will cover 25 per cent of the erection cost and 50 per cent of equipment costs.

The receipt of the \$50,000 was reported at the meeting of the School Board last night.

A. Gordon Leavitt, secretary, said he had placed the money in the bank to start a sinking fund. He suggested it be invested in Dominion of Canada registered stock.

URGES TAKING N. B. BONDS

Mr. Nagle asked if it might not be better to have the money in New Brunswick bonds, a new issue of which will be made shortly.

The matter was referred to the Finance Committee.

Returned Missionary From Palestine Is Former New Brunswicker

Rev. E. O. Jago, returned missionary from Palestine, who last night gave his first address in the Bible and missionary conference that will be held for one week in the Prince Edward street church, is a native of New Brunswick, but last night preached the first time in his native province.

He was born in Clifton, Gloucester county, and his father being the manager of a business concern in Boston, the family removed to that city and Mr. Jago received most of his education there. From Boston he went to missionary work in Palestine 25 years ago. His years of service in that territory are longer than those of any other North American missionary in Palestine.

It is 80 years since Mr. Jago visited his birthplace and although he will be unable to find time in his present itinerary to go into Gloucester county and meet his home people he is planning to return to New Brunswick for that purpose in the summer time. His mother was one of the first graduates of the New Brunswick normal school and taught school in this province for some time.
