

PAUSED SCARE IN ATLANTIC CITY

Bullets in Dry War Passed Over Boardwalk and Strollers Scruried to Shelter.

Atlantic City, N. J., June 20.—A fleet of high-speed cruisers supposed to have been fired by the members of the Coast Guard.

Persons who accidentally became the target of stray bullets made angry protests today to Congressman Isaac Bacharach of this district.

The rout of the liquor smugglers occurred at a place between the Royal Pavilion and the Royal Palace Hotel.

Lightning Reveals Cruisers. Suddenly the skies were reft with flashes of lightning, which disclosed a fleet of about five powerful cruisers.

"The matter has been placed before Congressman Bacharach," said Hackney after he and other property owners had registered their protest.

"The rum boats were less than 100 yards away from the coast guard boats, and I don't think one of the bullets fired found its mark.

Investigation is Under Way. Captain Holdikom, head of the Coast Guard Station at Atlantic City, was reticent when questioned about the naval engagement off the boardwalk.

"No one was hurt among the coast guards," said Captain Holdikom. "I do not know whether anybody was injured aboard the liquor boats."
