PRIEST REQUESTS WOMEN TO WEAR MODEST DRESSES

New York, July 13.—A special to the World from Philadelphia, under yesterday's date, says:
"Finding that three previous sermons in which he inveighed against modern styles for women had little or no tangible effect on members of his congregation, the Rev. J. P. Monville, Rector of the Roman Catholic church of the Holy Child Jesus at Shuron Hill, a fashionable suburb, yesterday bade individual women in his congregation to pin their waists closer around the neck before they came to the altar for communion."

HOW TO CAN SUMMER FRUITS WITHOUT SUGAR

Can berries without sugar? Yes, indeed. It can be done by the cold pack method and the berries will keep just as well without sugar as with it.
Preparing the jars: Fill clean jars three-fourths full of cold water and place on a rack in a wash-bowl which should contain enough water to cover the jars. Bring the water to a boil and continue boiling, taking out jars as needed.
Preparing berries: Wash and hull strawberries; wash other berries; remove jars from boiler and set in a pan of hot water. Fill the jars with berries and cover with boiling water. This will cause the berries to shrink, so that by the time the last jar is filled there may be added to each. Adjust the rubbers, half seal the jars, put back into the boiler and process (boil) twenty minutes. Remove from boiler, seal the jars and invert to cool.
The berries will shrink and there will be a good deal of juice in the jars. Before serving, this may be poured off sugar added and a dash of syrup made, or sugar may be added at the table.
Use this same method when canning with sugar, but substitute a thin syrup for the boiling water. The syrup is made by boiling together for one minute one cup of sugar and two cups of water. Allow one cup of syrup for each pint jar. When the jars of fruit are in the boiler process them fifteen minutes instead of twenty.
