Chicago, Nov. 15.—Statistics showing that complaints of cruelty to wife and children have increased 238 per cent since prohibition arrived, and more rapidly in the last six months than during the first half of the year, were given in the annual report of Albert E. Webster, superintendent of the Juvenile Protective Association, made public today.
