Food Board Flashes In the course of his survey of food conditions in Europe Mr. Hoover makes the statement that, thanks to the efforts of the Allied countries which had a surplus of food, there has been no actual loss of life by starvation among the ten million people of Belgium and Northern France. Poland and Serbia, on the other hand, have lost one-fourth of their people through starvation.

"My survey of the rest of Europe—the Baltic States and Poland—is not complete," says Mr. Hoover, "but sufficient evidence is at hand to show that before next harvest relief of an unprecedented character must be extended if the remaining population is to be maintained in any semblance of health, and it is almost inevitable that our people will be called upon to contribute liberally."

EGG AND POTATO SCALLOP. Two hard boiled eggs, One and a half cups cooked diced po

One and a half cups cream sauce.

Half cup of bread crumbs.

Salt and peper to taste.

Method—Boil the eggs and slice them.
Arrange in a baking dish layers of cooked diced potatoes and sliced egg. Add cream sauce. Sprinkle the top with the crumbs and bake in a moderate oven for twenty minutes. This may be varied by the addition of minced haw or left-over bacon or the addition of half cup of grated cheese in the cream sauce and a little cayenne pepper.
