FORTY HOURS A WEEK MINIMUM WAGES OF \$5 A DAY

Suggested Canadian Movement—A Word of Caution by Minister of Labor

Toronto, Feb. 15—On the ground that it would be the most effective means of solving unemployment situation, special representatives of the trade unions who met last night resolved that the dominion government should make a law to the effect that the minimum working week should be forty hours, with a minimum wage of \$5 a day.

The resolution was passed in the presence of Senator Gideon Robertson, minister of labor, and he responded by cautioning the trades unions to use moderation, "or he felt that if too strong demands are made upon industry at this time, the demands are apt to return in the form of a bonanza."

"In my opinion," he said, "the government should be the minimum wage."
