Brandon, Man., April 25—The civic employees of Brandon, to the number of about ninety, went on strike yesterday to enforce recognition of their union and the appointment of a conciliation board to fix a schedule. Five firemen have been left on duty to respond to emergency calls.

The men also demand reinstatement of two union officials who were dismissed by the council as a result of a recommendation of the finance committee to economize by cutting down the city hall staff. Strikers include policemen, firemen, street railway men, four members of the city hall staff and some laborers. The council has announced that it is willing to meet all employees to discuss matters of mutual interest but will not officially recognize the union.

London Truth's Comment on Titles in Old Country and Canada

London April 25—(Canadian Associated Press)—The remarks that it is interesting to observe the hostility of Canadians towards the bestowal of titles grows stronger with the increasing indulgence of the mother country in these tinsel honors. An undertaking has been given that no further titles shall be bestowed on Canadians unless through the recommendation of the dominion prime minister. In the present state of public opinion he dare not make any such recommendation. On the king's birthday, it is understood, a special gazette will contain 25,000 names for peace honors of various kinds. If this is true the ceremony of investiture will probably continue when the court is in London for the next three years.
