PETER'S PENCE. A SHOOTING AFFAIR.

His Removal Brings to Light Some New Facts Concerning the Commission Appointed to Investigate the Case of Peter's Pence.

It has now become known that last winter Mr. Fohli, supported by Prince Bismarck and the Emperor, resolved, in order to save the Banco di Roma, in which the Vatican held 10,000 out of 12,000 shares, to establish, first in Paris and London, and afterwards in Rome, Berlin and New York, a syndicate of Catholic banks, with the object of absorbing the financial societies of Rome, which were known to be in a disastrous condition, and to restore them to vitality, while at the same time raising the value of the depreciated securities.

At that time financial circles in Rome were interested in supporting the creation of these Catholic banks, and they were desirous of helping this financial movement in order to put the Banco di Roma on a firmer footing.

Consequently, Mr. Fohli proposed to the commission of cardinals (which is purely consultative) that the Vatican should enter into the combination to the extent of 1,000,000 lire.
