(Préparation de l'Examen Préliminaire comportant inscription à l'Université).

Scheffmacher: Manuel de controverse. Boylesvo: Principes de Littérature. "L'examen Préliminaire pour les candidats de langue française embrasse le Latin, les Mathématiques, le Français, l'Histoire et la Géographie, et de plus: (a) soit le Grec, (b) soit l'Anglais et l'Allemand, (c) soit l'Allemand et la Botanique." *University Calendar*, 1897-8, p. 7.

Latin: César, (B. G. liv. II, III, IV) Virgile (*Æn.* I); thème facile sans dictionnaire: questions de grammaire et d'érudition.

Grec: Xénophon, (liv. de White, p. 1-59, 65, 68, 72, 74, 79, 100), Homère (II, VI); thème facile sans dictionnaire; grammaire et érudition.

Arithmetic: All Hamblin Smith.

Algebra: C. Smith's Elementary Algebra up to chap. XXI.

Euclid: Books I, II, III.

Analyse littéraire du Télémaque de Fénelon, La Bruyère (Caractères), Racine, Esther; Molière, Misanthrope.

Histoire de France, depuis le règne de Louis XIV jusqu'à la fin (Chantrel). Histoire Romaine, depuis la première guerre punique jusqu'à la mort d'Auguste (Drioux). Histoire du Canada (Laverdière).

Critical reading of Shakespeare: The Tempest, Julius Caesar; Selections from Irving, Lamb, Lowell and Gladstone; Writing of Essays. History of England: Green, chapters III., VII., and IX.; Bourinot: How Canada is Governed.

BELLES-LETTRES.

(Preliminary Examination).

Historical Catechism. Art of Composition. "All English-speaking candidates for the Preliminary Examination must take the fixed subjects in Latin, Mathematics, English, History and Geography, and in one of the following groups: (a) Greek, (b) French and German, (c) French and Botany, (d) German and Botany." *University Calendar*, 1897-8, p. 7.

Latin: César, Bell. Gall. II., III., IV.; Virgil, *Æneid.* I.; with simple prose composition, grammatical and explanatory questions.

Greek: Xenophon, White's Beginner's Greek Book, pages 1-59, 65, 68, 72, 74, 79, 100; Homer, *Iliad* VI; with simple prose composition, grammatical and explanatory questions.

Literary analysis of Selections from Tennyson, Gray, Cowper and Scott.

English History, from the Revolution of 1688 to the peace of 1815 (Green). Roman History, (Creighton's Rome.—Primer). Greek History (Fyffe's Greece.—Primer).

Geography: "Physical and Mathematical; commercial and physical geography of Europe and America more particularly." *Univ. Cal.* Special attention should be given to the first 46 pages of Chase's High School Geography, which have been purposely omitted from the lower classes as too learned for the average pupil of these classes.
