

# General Statement,

1888-9.

THE Twentieth Session of the Halifax Medical College will be opened on Monday, October 29th.

The regular order of lectures will begin on that day and will be continued during the six months following.

It is very desirable that all students should, as far as possible, be in attendance at the date of the opening of the session, as otherwise they are placed at much disadvantage.

"The Halifax School of Medicine" was founded in 1867 as the Medical Department of Dalhousie University. In 1875 it became a separate corporation under the name of "The Halifax Medical College." In 1876 it was affiliated with the University of Halifax, but this body having for some years become inoperative, it has now affiliated with Dalhousie University, and in future all students attending this College who comply with the curriculum laid down by the Governors of Dalhousie University will on presentation of the required certificates be admitted to the examinations for degrees in Medicine and Surgery at that University.

The College building erected for the special purpose of medical teaching is in everyway fitted for the object in view. It is situated in an open, airy locality in close proximity to the Victoria General Hospital and the new University building. The lecture room, dissecting room, etc., are well lighted, warmed and ventilated, and are fitted with appliances for imparting knowledge in the different subjects of medical education.

Certificates of attendance on the various courses of lectures are accepted as qualifying candidates for examination before the licensing bodies of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Medical Schools in Canada and the United States.
