

## BORDEN PLEASED WITH CANADIANS

Visits Many Camps — Took Particular Notice of French Troops Under Training Just One Day.

London, July 22.—(By The Associated Press)—Sir Robert Borden has returned to London after visiting several Canadian camps in the country with General Turner. During the tour he met General Emsley and addressed a large gathering of soldiers, dwelling upon the individual responsibility of every one to do his part. The premier particularly noticed one regiment of the French-Canadians who had been under training here only one day. Sir Robert Borden visited the headquarters of Colonel Borden and Major Deserrie and then passed on to the Nova Scotia headquarters, under Colonel Muirhead.

At another camp under Colonel Colquhoun, Sir Robert Borden saw a thousand men parade and later passed to General Garnet Hughes' command, where he spoke for half an hour to a other thousand Canadians. At every camp he visited the premier was informed that the men under training were making remarkable progress and it was impossible for them to be keener on business.

## SYMPATHY IN ENGLAND FOR NICHOLAS' FATE

Newspapers However Do Not Splash Much Type About Concerning It.

London, July 22.—Recent reports and a recognition that probably the former emperor would suffer a violent death eliminated the element of surprise in the killing of Nicholas Romanoff, which none the less, excites sympathy here and has caused some strong denunciations of the perpetrators to the crime.

Nicholas never was a hero in this country for he had always been regarded as weak and a poor specimen of a sovereign, but it is admitted that he had good intentions which by the tragedy of his weakness he was unable to realize.

The news of his death, which in ordinary times would have filled the newspapers and called for the biggest type appears in most papers inconspicuously, and with one or two exceptions without editorial comment.


**Miss Mary Jones.**


