## Live Canadian Political Topics

No Successor to Hon. Frank B. Carvell Yet — United Farmers' Party Want Longer Hours.

The Ottawa correspondent of the Toronto Telegram wired his paper on Friday:

"Among yesterday's arrivals were Sir Douglas Hailey, Chief Justice of New Brunswick, and Stanley Elkin, M. P. for St. John, both of whom have been spoken of as successors to Hon. F. B. Carvell in the New Brunswick representation. Sir Douglas says he is here on his way to Washington to sign the Fisheries Treaty as acting the Minister of Fisheries. He headed a commission on international fisheries. Incidentally he comes for the state dinner. He professes to know nothing of the Premier's intentions regarding Cabinet adjustments. Mr. Elkin says he is up for the session. The field selection is not wide and some very important factors enter into it. For one thing, Mr. Carvell was a Liberal. If his successor in the Cabinet be a Conservative the effect upon the Liberal-Unionist vote is incalculable. It will not be surprising if nothing is done in the matter till after the session, though sometimes these changes are torn off at very short notice."

Mr. Rowell's Sacrifice.

(London Free Press.)

Remarking that the treacheries of politics are responsible for many tragedies, The Orange Sentinel says that Hon. N. W. Rowell sacrificed his Liberal leadership and ultimately the premiership of Canada in the performance of duty at a critical hour in his country's history. Says The Sentinel: "If he had, like Mr. King, stuck to Laurier, Mr. Rowell would undoubtedly have been the leader of the Opposition instead of Mr. King. To have served the country is better than to have served a party. Mr. Rowell's sacrifice from that thought more satisfaction than he would from being the leader of a party. His reward must be of the nature of a lesser man keeps the honors that were his had he been unfaithful to himself."

The Sentinel says that Mr. Rowell's prominence in the Liberal party is the cause of the intense bitterness shown toward him today. It speaks of "the vulgar display made by W. E. Knowles, that of any other at the convention but which was received with enthusiasm." When mentioning Mr. Rowell's name in the course of his speech, Mr. Knowles spoke upon the platform. The Sentinel adds:

"Not many public men earn such enmity as that. That is the price Mr. Rowell has to pay for standing behind the men in the trenches during the darkest days of the war."

There is another feature that is not as readily apprehended by the man on the street, thinks The Sentinel. This is the part that the Liberal press played in Mr. Rowell's decision to join with Sir Robert Borden. Nearly every Liberal newspaper that party organ carried him into the Union Government and applauded his action. Says the Sentinel:

"And now? They are all for King and none for Rowell. They will not assail Mr. Rowell, but they will be accomplices of the French leaders who have sworn to destroy him."

Not many public men, The Sentinel feels, have been able to point to blacker ingratitude than Mr. Rowell is receiving from the Liberal press.

The U. F. O. and Labor. (Toronto Times.)

The U. F. O. candidate in East Wellington would reduce the cost of living by lengthening the working hours in cities to correspond with those on the farm.

His argument is that if workmen in shops and factories would labor from 10 to 16 hours a day they would greatly increase their individual productivity and so be able to release many hands for employment on the land. This, contends the U. F. O. candidate, would stimulate the production of food commodities, and so reduce the cost of living.

An effort has been made to consolidate the Labor and U. F. O. movements. It will not be furthered by the proposed merger in East Wellington. The shortened working day is the result of two generations of Labor. The U. F. O. has already fought this hard-won prize, even to being at the farmers. The chief effect of the East Wellington suggestion is to encourage the Labor Union in its inactivity of Trade Unionism and the U. F. O.

Good Appointment. (Toronto Times.)
