OFFICIAL INQUIRY HELD AT CHATHAM

Chief Inspector Wilson has entered upon an official inquiry into the complaints of brutal conduct that have been made against two Chacham sub-inspectors, with all the ceremony of a Royal Commission. He has Mr. Hughes hired at \$25 a day and expenses; and Mr. McPeake, stemographer, who must be paid at least \$50 a day for reporting and transcribing the testimony. He neglected to bring a court orfer, sergeant-at-arms and clerk of the court in addition to the others. His cost, including travelling and hotel bills, must be about \$125 a day, not including his own salary. 
