Okanagar himself a cattle owner and a resident for 12 years beside the dwrains who also stated that he could speak their language decidedly questioned the centure.

I invited him to the camp I said "take a pencil - put down" "names of men, and the slock" "cach has". He did to, and I thank alock the hearty laid his pencil Journ, having already excelled the census.

The letter of Mr James Leniham, now under review, seems to me to contain a partion of the common talk of persons who, without Knowledge of the means of acquiring it in reference to the Snorman
