50° RAISE When Prince Edward Island native, Hugh McBeth, joined the Royal Northwest Mounted Police in 1919, a constable was paid \$1.50 per day. After three years' service, a constable received a 50¢ raise and earned \$2 per day. "We thought we were rich when we received that extra 50 cents.", Mr. McBeth said recently after receiving his discharge papers from Sgt. Hal Marshall, PCR Co-ordinator for "L" Division.

Mr. McBeth, one of the few remaining members of the RNWMP, is now 91 and lives in the Garden Nursing Home in Charlottetown. He joined the Force in Charlottetown at the age of 26 after serving overseas in World War I. Mr. McBeth was transferred 26 times during his career. He served in Manitoba and Ontario and worked in the Canadian North for six tours of duty. Mr. McBeth retired at the rank of sergeant on a medical pension in 1945.
