Canadiens Defeated Seattle, 4 to 3

Come From Behind and O Score Opponents

Seattle March 30 (Endurance) won a great game of hockey last night and tied up the series of the hockey championship. Coming from behind after being outplayed for two periods, the Canadiens defeated Seattle in the second overtime game of the series 4 to 3 before a crowded house of 4,000 people.

The finish was as spectacular as Wednesday's affair. The Seattle men were exhausted when Jack McDonald the visiting substitute player skated down the ice and notched the tally that won the contest. Saturday night's game was simply another instance of a team playing itself out in the early stages and succumbing to a squad which had conserved its strength.

The Canadiens are 50 per cent the stronger club in the final period, and that they would eventually score the final goal was evident to the close followers of the play. To Captain Lalonde and his players credit is due for staging one of the greatest "comebacks" in hockey history. Many a team with a three to nothing score staring it in the face has been known to give up the ghost, but not the Frenchmen last night.

Realizing that they were conditioned for the last period, the Montreal skaters grabbed their advantage by the forelock and when they finally emerged winners after the bitter extra session few fans begrudged them the victory.

Several of the Seattle men are under the care of a doctor as a result of the strenuous game. Frank Foyston had his thigh injured after a mix-up in centre ice and is a sick man, while Cully Wilson is showing the effects of the strenuous pace he maintained, and two or three others are nursing minor injuries.

The Frenchmen are in much better shape. Carleton being the only member of the visitors to show any effects. Cleghorn scored the first Canadian goal, but it was the great and only Lalonde who was responsible for the Montreal win. Urging his team on, Lalonde was not only a tower of strength on the defense, but he scored the second and tying goals himself.

Winning Goal to McDonald. McDonald's final goal was another great play. The Montreal substitute cleverly evaded the two Seattle defense men and shot through from a corner for the winning goal. The game was not as rough as the Wednesday affair, but the checking was just as hard. In fact the hard-checking
