Second place was secured by Dick Nelson, a Winnipeg man, with Kingston and Hart, two Calgary men running third and fourth. The course was for (ix miles, starting and ending at the Herald office.

Hon. Beresford's Death.

The wreck in which Hon. DeLaval J. Beresford was killed, and which was reported in last week's Times, brought death to nine people. It occurred on the Soo line at Conception, N.D., and was caused by the passenger train colliding with a freight train, which was shunting at the station.

The brakeman, a green hand, had gone back to flag the passenger, but for some reason the incoming train kept on without slowing up. The jury severely censured the company for placing inexperienced men in such important positions.

Beresford's body is being sent to England after being embalmed in Minneapolis. Deceased was a cousin of Lord Charles Beresford, rear admiral of the British Mediterranean fleet and closely resembled him in appearance.

School Changes.

Two New Teachers Secured.—A New Room Opened.

The mid-winter adjustment of school at the public schools has been completed. Several pupils have been advanced into a higher standard although still continuing the work of the former grade. This was found necessary owing to the rapidly increasing number attending the schools. A new room had to be opened and the teacher is Miss Fowler, formerly principal of Clarendon school. She will teach standard IV and have a room in Toronto St. school. Miss McNiece who has resigned her position for other duties has not been succeeded as yet. A Miss Glanville was offered the position and upon her refusing, it has been offered to Miss McCallum now teaching in Virgil Man. Her duties will be in Standard II.
