For Uniting the Legislatures of the Provinces

LOWER AND UPPER CANADA.

HEREAS in the present situation of the Provinces Preamble. of Lower and Upper Canada, as such with relation to Great Britain as to each other, a joint Legislature for both the said Provinces would be more likely to promote their general security and prosperity than a separate Legislature for each of the said Provinces, as at present by law established; -Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, That so much of an Act passed in the thirty-first year of the so much of reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intitul
of Majesty King George "Government of the Province of Quebec in North Ame- Upper Canada, re-"' rica,' and to make further provision for the Govern-pealed.
"ment of the said Province," as provides for the composing and constituting within each of the said Provinces respectively, a Legislative Council and Assembly, and for the passing of laws by the Legislative Council and Assembly of each Province, shall be and the same is hereby repealed, except in so far as the same or any of the provisi-
